

GENERAL SHOW RULES

GENERAL INFORMATION

All entry blanks must be completely and accurately filled out on TPEA entry forms before a horse is allowed to enter the arena for the class. The TPEA Show Secretary will not fill out entry forms and will not be held responsible for submitting incomplete show results to PHBA. Pre-entries should be entered on-line or mailed to the Show Chairman (post-marked) no later than the Monday preceding the show. Owners and Exhibitors must be members of TPEA to show. A signed check or cash payment will be made day of show - no exceptions.

A copy of the PHBA registration papers, current coggins, membership, youth, and amateur cards must be presented for inspection by show management. The Show Committee reserves the right to accept and refuse entries cordially.

INDIVIDUAL SHOW AWARDS

Ribbons are given from first through sixth place. Rosettes are given for Grand and Reserve Champions. All-Around High Points for the show are given to: Open Senior Horse, Open Junior Horse, Amateur, Amateur

Select, Novice Amateur, Youth 5-9 (Walk-Trot), Youth 13 & Under, & Youth 14-18. Different High Point & Reserve High Point awards are given for each show. In order to be eligible, ALL Entries **MUST DECLARE FOR HIGH POINT ON THE ENTRY FORM!**

ELIGIBILITY FOR HIGH POINTS AT THE SHOW

OPEN: Must show in Halter &/or Color and two performance events.

YOUTH: Must show in Showmanship and two other performance classes. Points are kept for one horse/one rider.

AMATEUR, AMATEUR SELECT and NOVICE AMATEUR: Must show in three performance events. Points are kept for one horse/one rider. Amateurs may show in more than one division (if eligible) but may only declare for one High Point Award. If the classes are combined, their points will be counted for the designated High Point.

(Speed events do not count in any division)

TIES

Ties for High Point will be broken as follows:

Open -The winner of the tie shall be declared in accordance to the following:

- A. The horse entered in the most classes.
- B. The horse that won the most first places.
- C. The horse that won the most second places.

Amateur, Amateur Select & Novice - Ties will be broken in accordance with the Open rules. (A, B &C)

Youth - The youth exhibitor that places the highest in Showmanship shall be declared the winner. If tied in Showmanship then the Open rules (B & C) are used.

SPONSORSHIP OF CLASSES

Sponsorships with a value of \$500.00 or more will be reviewed by the State Board of Directors. The State Board of Directors has the authority to approve the conditions of the donation and set a time deadline that the funds must be received by TPEA.

ELIGIBILITY FOR YEAR END AWARDS

To be eligible for TPEA Year-End Awards, the owner and exhibitor must be a member of TPEA and the owner

must be a resident of Texas at the time the points were won. If the horse is sold, the Open points will transfer, if the new owner is a member of TPEA and a resident of Texas at the time the transfer of ownership is recorded by PHBA. In the case of joint ownership, at least one owner must be a resident of Texas and all owners must be members of TPEA. Ownership shall be determined by PHBA.

To be eligible for TPEA-Youth, Amateur, Select Amateur and Novice Amateur Year-End Awards, the exhibitor and owner must be a member of TPEA and the exhibitor and owner must be a resident of Texas at the time the points were won. See: Required Work Segments.

Year End Award(s) will be withheld from any owner and/or exhibitor for failure to pay when due any obligation owed to TPEA. NO EXCEPTIONS! Work segments must be worked, recorded & approved or the award will go to the next eligible horse.

YEAR-END AWARDS

1. To be eligible for Year-End Awards, two (2) segments must be worked for each horse during the year. It is that person's responsibility to accurately log in the work segment book (back number and name of horse, etc.) and be verified by the office staff or show chairman in order for those segments to be counted.

Segments are defined as follows:

- ! All halter classes
- ! All English classes
- ! Western Parade thru Trail
- ! Ranch Horse thru Speed classes

If work segments are not completed, the next eligible horse will receive the Year-End Award(s). These rules are in addition to any other requirements.

2. Year-End High Point Halter awards through 3rd place will be presented to the Stallion, Mare, and Gelding with the most halter Points.
3. Year-End High Point Overall Awards through 5th place will be given to the Junior Horse & Senior Horse with the most points. (Horses must have at least ten halter &/or color points and at least ten performance points in two different events.)

4. The Baker Award will be presented to the Overall High Point Open Horse that has accumulated the most points. (Horses must have at least 10 halter &/or color points and at least 10 performance points in two different events in open classes)
5. Year-End High Point Awards through 5th place will be given in these divisions: Amateur, Amateur Select, Novice Amateur, Youth 5-9 (Walk-Trot), Youth 13 & Under, and Youth 14-18.
6. Year-End High Point Awards through 3rd place will be given in each individual class if eligibility has been met. A horse, youth or Amateur must have earned at least 10 points in that class. Exception: There are no point requirements for weanlings, 2 year old snaffle bit or longe line horses. Awards may be combined if the horse has won more than one.
7. Year-End High point Award will be given to Out-of-State Exhibitor/Owner.
